Activities: All activities recognised / authorised by the British Judo Association Limited (BJA) including but not limited to club administration, training, grading, competitions, Judo Fit, Gymnastics for Judo, Judo for self defence, club social events as authorised by the BJA

Cover
This covers legal liability for damages and legal costs arising out of Third Party loss, injury or damage, in connection with the activities described above and notified to Hiscox Insurance Company Ltd, QBE Insurance (Europe) Ltd & W R Berkley UK Ltd within the period noted above. Cover includes public liability, professional indemnity, liability for damage to leased and rented premises, indemnity to principals and liability arising out of goods sold or supplied including refreshments.

The cover is written on a "claims made" wording, which means that the cover will respond on the policy in place when the claim is made, not the policy in place when the incident occurred. Unlike other forms of insurance, there has to be a policy in force at the time at which the claim is made against you and at the time the activity was undertaken. Once a policy is cancelled, expires or lapses no cover would be provided for any claim notified after the date of cancellation, expiry or lapse.

All incidents that may give rise to a claim in the future should be notified to Hiscox, QBE & WRB Insurance through Perkins Slade Ltd, at the time of incident.

- If the Insured Person is 1) under the age of 16 or ii) not in regular gainful employment Benefit 4 shall read Permanent Total Disablement from gainful employment of any & every kind
- The maximum benefit payable under broken bones shall be limited to £500 (£250 for Insured Persons aged 65-75)any one accident

Excess £50 in respect of Dental Expenses

The benefits are payable if during the period of Insurance, the Insured Person suffers accidental bodily injury resulting directly and independently of any other cause within 2 years in death, loss or disablement



INCIDENT NOTIFICATION GUIDELINES

It is important that all incidents that may give rise to a claim are reported to us as soon as possible after the event. This will enable Insurers to carry out investigations at an early stage whilst information relating to the claim remains fresh in the mind. This will also ensure that you are complying fully with your policy terms and conditions.

In order to achieve this, we ask that you notify us immediately of any incident that involves:-

- a fatal accident.
- an injury involving either referral to or actual hospital treatment.
- any allegations of libel/slander.
- any allegations of Professional Negligence i.e. arising out of tuition, coaching or advice given.
- any investigation under any child protection legislation.
- any circumstance involving damage to third party property. An injury is defined as:-
- any head injury that requires medical treatment [Doctor or Hospital.]
- any fracture other than to fingers, thumbs or toes.
- any amputation, dislocation of the shoulder, hip, knee or spine.
- loss of sight [whether temporary or permanent.]
- any injury resulting from electrical shock or burn, leading to unconsciousness or requiring resuscitation or admittance to hospital for more than 24 hours.
- any other injury leading to hypothermia, heat induced illness or to unconsciousness which requires resuscitation or admittance to hospital for more than 24 hours.
- loss of consciousness caused by asphyxia or by exposure to a harmful substance or biological agent.

Please note the above list is not exhaustive and if you are unsure as to whether an incident should be reported, then please do not hesitate to contact Perkins Slade Claims Department for further advice.

We would remind you that in NO circumstances should you admit liability or agree to pay for any damage caused as this may prejudice the position of Insurers and COULD result in the withdrawal of any indemnity.

Finally, please note that this is a Liability Policy where Insurers decide if negligence attaches to you. Therefore any payments you make to any third parties will not necessarily be reimbursed.

INCIDENT RECORDING GUIDELINES

We would recommend that a designated person within your organisation is made responsible to record any reportable accident. Records must be kept for at least 3 years. Names and addresses of any possible witnesses should also be recorded.

Current legislation does not specify the format of an accident register but the Accident Book BI 510 obtainable from HMSO is frequently used and is approved by the Information Commissioner for D&A Compliance.

The register must contain the following information relating to all reportable accidents or dangerous occurrences:

- date and time of accident
- as regards a person at work - full name; occupation; nature of injury; age
- as regards a person not at work - full name; status [e.g. customer]; nature of injury; age
- place where accident occurred
- a brief description of the circumstances
- method by which the event was reported.

REPORTING INCIDENT TO HEALTH & SAFETY EXECUTIVE
